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Short Course Description	This course is a practical course on creating fashion designs according to the theme, especially the practice of creating fashion designs for Ready-To-Wear. The discussion begins with forming a committee, preparing proposals for fashion show activities (final works), and preparing a final portfolio of works. Then take measurements of the model/mannequin and mannequin. The next stages are making a large pattern according to the size of the model (mannequin), cutting the material, sewing using the right sewing technique, fitting, pressing, and finishing techniques. The final stage of the practical activity is to assess the results of the practice (Fashion Show) using industry assessment standards. The course implementation uses an individual and classical approach in the form of Project Work and Cooperative Learning, which is equipped with the use of two-dimensional media, and projection media in the form of multimedia (LCD) as well as giving assignments within the practical scope of making bridal clothing.

- Learning Outcomes of Study Program Graduates (PLO - Study Program)** are the abilities possessed by each Study Program graduate which are the internalization of attitudes, mastery of knowledge and skills according to the level of their study program obtained through the learning process.
- The PLO imposed on courses** are several learning outcomes of study program graduates (CPL-Study Program) which are used for the formation/development of a course consisting of aspects of attitude, general skills, special skills and knowledge.

- Learning materials** are details or descriptions of study materials which can be presented in the form of several main points and sub-topics.
